BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR ENG 108

Students will engage in exploratory journal writing and pre-writing exercises in which they will learn how to analyze, synthesize, and evaluate the thinking of others in order to discover, develop, and test their own ideas and points of view.

Students will complete 5-6 writing assignments in ENG 108. Three of these assignments will require research for which students will submit all notes and pre-writing exercises, and two or three shorter papers.
