Current Research and Paper Presentations:

During the last several years I have been working on a biography of Lloyd C. Stark, governor of Missouri, 1936-40. My last two articles, published in the *Missouri Historical Review*, reflect my progress on this project. Currently, I am working on Stark's crusade for a Kansas City, Missouri, police bill, which when passed by the Missouri legislature would transfer control of the police commission from the city government to the governor's office. I presented a paper "Governor Lloyd C. Stark, Organized Crime, and the Kansas City Police Bill of 1939," March 31, 2006, at the Missouri Conference on History, Sedalia, Missouri. This paper is currently being revised for submission for publication. During this time I have written and presented a paper, "Organized Crime and New Deal Justice: The Angelo Donnici Case of 1939," on April 4, 2008, at the Missouri Conference on History, Columbia, Missouri. A revision of this paper has been accepted for publication in the October 2009 *Missouri Historical Review*. I have continued research on Stark's attempt to defeat Senator Harry Truman in the state-wide Democratic party primary of 1940. In addition, I have been gathering research material on other subjects. First, I would like to do a biography of Senator Bennett C. Clark of Missouri, 1932-44. I have read his entire correspondence, gathered pertinent information, and continue to collect materials, as I research in other related areas. Second, I have collected relevant materials to organized crime in Kansas City, 1918-1943. And, third, I have been accumulating documentation on the evolution of the federal income tax from 1932-1944 and the Works Progress Administration in Missouri, 1935-1942.
