GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Official transcript showing completion of a B.S. or M.S. from an accredited college or university.
- Undergraduate GPA = 2.75 or higher or completion of a previous M.S.
- Students admitted to a graduate program must enroll and begin classes at MWSU within the next academic year after receiving official notice of acceptance from the Graduate Office
- Applicants who are not citizens of the United States must receive a score of 550 or above on the paper-based or 61 or above on the internet-based Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), unless the applicant is from a country where English is the native language or they possess a baccalaureate degree from a college or university in which the primary language of instruction was English.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Filing of an approved Application for Graduation.
- Satisfactory completion of all required course work as listed on the approved Program of Study.
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00 in coursework required on the program of study

PROGRAM GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of 36 credit hours of the program of study.
- 18 of the 36 total credit hours must be taken at the 600 level.
- The specified number of graduate level hours with a grade of B or better in each course.
- An oral examination*
- A written examination*

*The Executive Director of the Southern Institute of Forensic Science and a committee appointed by Missouri Western State University's Department of Criminal Justice and Legal Studies will determine successful completion of these exams.
