FB20-082 ROOF REPLACEMENT WILSON HALL

Invitations for bid were advertised in two newspapers for two days and specifications were sent to thirteen (13) potential vendors. Six (6) bids were received for the base bid of roof replacement at Wilson Hall.

Wilson Hall's roof is leaking and is beyond its warranty period. The project includes removal of existing roofing systems and replacement that includes insulation, cover board and new TPO membrane and flashings. The roof will include a 20 year warranty.

Ellison-Auxier Architects verified the pricing with Seaman & Schuske Metal Works to ensure that it met our requirements and the price includes specifications outlined in the bid.

The Administration recommends acceptance of the base bid from Seaman & Schuske Metal Works for the Base Bid.

The Administration also recommends that \$37,289.00 (10%) contingency budget be approved for any unforeseen costs.

Total amount for this project requested is \$372,899 and \$37,289 totaling \$410,188. This project will be paid with funds through the Wilson Hall account.

FB20-087 Bookstore Renovation

Invitations for bids were advertised in two newspapers and sent to fourteen (14) vendors. Four (4) construction companies responded with bids for work on Bookstore Renovation. This work includes new light fixtures, flooring and ceiling tile replacement, painting walls, electrical additions, mechanical revisions and removing walls and painting. Bid results are as follows:

Total amount for this project requested is \$233,500 and \$23,350 totaling \$256,850. This project will be paid for through the Hearnes Center account.

RFP20-092 STORAGE ARRAY REPLACEMENT

Invitations for bid were advertised in two newspapers and sent to nineteen (19) vendors. Three (3) vendors responded with bids for Storage Array Replacement. One vendor provided two separate options. The selected product will be used as an infrastructure component for all IT managed servers and services, affecting all users across the University. The total solution price includes support for 3 years. The array is expected to be installed and operational no later than June 1, 2020.

RFQ20-093 BENEFIT CONSULTING SERVICES

Missouri Western State University requested qualifications from Benefit Consulting Firms to provide professional services to include the renewal negotiation with all benefit vendors and to provide evaluation of insurance options. Missouri Western State University advertised in two newspapers for two days and sent the specifications to fourteen (14) firms. A committee was appointed to review the responses received from eight (8) Benefit Consulting firms. The committee reviewed each submission and narrowed the list to four (4) firms that aligned with our needs and were invited to make presentations. The firms were:

CBIZ met or exceeded our requirements per the RFQ. CBIZ's presentation was very positive proposal and included a live presentation. CBIZ is an exceptionally large organization with a local and Kansas City presence. They have considerable experience working with Higher Education benefit consulting. Their pricing is competitive. In addition, they will provide a Benefit Management System at no cost the first year and a very reasonable cost the second year (cost will be based on the number of employees). CBIZ is familiar with the local healthcare market having other local government clients. Our current vendor HUB International, submitted a proposal, however, the University believes it is time to move in a new direction with a different service approach.

Based upon the committee's review of the information, the Administration recommends the selection of CBIZ as Benefit Consultants as described in the Request for Qualifications with annual pricing of \$40,000 making the three-year total of \$120,000.

Subject: Tuition and Fee Proposal for FY20-21 – Board Meeting, May 28, 2020 (updated)

Please find attached three proposals for your consideration regarding tuition and fees for the fiscal year 2021 along with the current tuition and fee structure. Proposal one assumes a 2.6% increase and applies all to tuition; proposal two assumes a 1.0% increase to tuition, converts mandatory fees to a per credit hour basis, and removes the 12-credit hour cap; and proposal three assumes a 1.0% increase to tuition, reduces on-line tuition to the normal tuition rate, converts mandatory fees to a per credit hour basis, removes the 12-credit hour cap; assumes a 5% increase. Additionally, you will find proposed increases for residence halls and food service with varying options.

I will be discussing these proposals and will be presenting various scenarios on how each of these impact students and the university's financial position.
