
3D ARTS ANNEX - CONCEPTUAL DRAWING



Potter Hall's current art studios were part of a 1986 addition to the original sixties-era building, and no longer serve the contemporary needs of the program. A new 19,000 square-foot facility proposes dedicated space for Sculpture & Ceramics with much-needed natural daylight and ventilation systems. The proposed Annex will be located northwest of Potter Hall with a unique courtyard and art walk that connect the two buildings.



3D ARTS ANNEX

The proposed 3D Arts Annex will contain Ceramics and Sculpture studios, which are currently on the first floor in Potter Hall. The Sculpture studio will have two separate spaces, the wood and metal works. In the current studio, they are combined.

The new Ceramics space will allow for six additional pottery wheels and an outdoor kiln yard.

A separate space for the 3D arts is exciting for several reasons. The additional square footage will allow for more student work space, efficient project management, improved ventilation and a safe division of disciplines.

The studio classes allow students to express their creativity while utilizing critical thinking and problemsolving skills, attributes that will be a great benefit to them in their careers. According to a World Economic Forum study, in the list of the top 10 skills in 2020 that companies want from their employees, complex problem solving was #1, critical thinking was #2 and creativity was #3.
