Academic Attire

The graduate hood provides color and meaning for the costume. The colored lining of the interior of the hood is the official color or colors of the institution granting the degree. The binding or edging of the hood is of velvet or velveteen and represents the faculty or department.

The colors of representative fields are:
White - Arts, Letters and Humanities;
Drab - Commerce and Business Administration;
Light Blue - Education; Orange - Engineering Technology
Management; Brown - Fine Arts; Purple - Law;
Lemon - Library Science; Pink - Music; Apricot - Nursing;
Dark Blue - Philosophy; Sage Green - Physical Education;
Yellow - Science; Scarlet - Theology.

The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist with the rear part of its oblong shape square cut and the front part with an arc cutaway. It may be worn open or closed.

The doctor's gown is faced with black velvet and has three bars across the bell-shaped sleeves. These facings and crossbars may be of colored velvet to represent the degree, and agree in color with the binding or edging of the hood. The tassel for the doctor's cap may be of gold thread.

Symbols of Academic Tradition and Excellence

Pageantry, honor, and celebration are traditional elements of university academic ceremonies. As symbols of events and affiliations, academic regalia and medallions can be traced back to the Middle Ages. With Missouri Western's designation as a University, these symbols have become a part of the academic tradition at Missouri Western State University.

Seal: The seal is the official visual representation of the university as a legal entity and is to be used on official documents of the institution. The university seal is circular with the name Missouri Western State University and the year of the institution's founding, 1915, in the outer ring. The six core values that are fundamental to Missouri Western's mission are listed in the next ring of print. They are Service, Quality, Enthusiasm, Freedom, Respect, and Courage. The center of the seal features the Griffon, a mythical creature first conceived in Europe in the Middle Ages that combines the body of the lion and the eagle. It may be understood to symbolize courage and imagination. The Griffon is also known as the protector of "treasure." Recognizing that education is a treasure to be valued, the Griffon was selected to represent the higher education mission of the St. Joseph Junior College and has prevailed as Missouri Western's symbol since that time. It is the one symbol that unites the many generations of alumni through the various stages of the university's development. The Griffon as a symbol for Missouri Western has evolved over the years, and the current design is in the silhouette of the State of Missouri.

Presidential Medallion: The presidential medallion represents the authority and responsibility of the Office of the President. It is conferred upon the President of the university by the Board of Governors and becomes a part of the academic regalia of the President of Missouri Western State University. The medallion features the new seal of the university, a center link engraved with the title "President," and six links each of which is engraved with one of the values that are central to the university's strategic operations.
