Dual credit, by definition, is a college level course, taught at or delivered to the high school that allows students to receive college and high school credit simultaneously. If a student chooses to enroll in dual credit, an academic record is created and the grade will be transcribed at Missouri Western and on the high school transcript. Dual credit students are considered university students, and are held to the same rules and regulations as a university student; likewise, they have the same benefits as a university student. In accordance with the 6/3/2015 Coordinating Board for Higher Education Dual Credit Policy, dual credit students must meet the following requirements:

9th Grade

- Overall minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Score at the 90th percentile or above on the ACT or SAT
- Provide signed letter of recommendation from principal and guidance counselor
- Written permission from a parent or legal guardian

10th Grade

- Overall minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Provide signed letter of recommendation from principal and guidance counselor
- Written permission from a parent or legal guardian

11th and 12th Grades with an overall grade point average between 2.5 – 2.99 (on a 4.0 scale)

- Provide signed letter of recommendation from principal and guidance counselor
- Written permission from a parent or legal guardian

11th and 12th Grades with an overall minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) are automatically eligible for dual credit courses.
