POSITION TITLE

Transition Mentor in the Office of Admissions - 70 Positions Available

POSITION FUNCTION

To serve as a member of the Office of Admissions staff to facilitate and implement transition programs, such as Griffon Orientation, Griffon Edge, Griffon Showcase, and campus. Transition Mentors will work with campus departments, businesses, and other organizations to provide an opportunity for new members of the campus community to transition in a safe and positive environment. This is a one year appointment that students may re-apply for each year.

QUALIFICATIONS

- To qualify as a returning Transition Mentor applicant, the student must have been selected for a Transition Mentor role in a previous year AND completed the training curriculum in FULL.
- A 2.25 overall cumulative grade point average at the time of application and throughout time on staff.
- Understand and support the goals of the Office of Admissions transition programs.
- Not currently on academic or disciplinary probation.

PREFERRED PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

- Strong work ethic: Willingness to go above and beyond to get the job done
- Creative thinking skills
- Positive attitude
- Flexibility
- Ability to communicate with individuals from diverse backgrounds and varying personality types: Appreciation of the differences among individuals
- Leadership skills
- Punctuality
- Ability to work as an effective and productive team member
- Commitment to a high standard of ethical values and behavior
- Self-Confidence
- Ability to be tactful and diplomatic in all situations
- Service-oriented
- Passion for Missouri Western

Specific Duties for Transition Mentor Programs

NOTE: The Office of Admissions' Transition Programs are designed and implemented through a team driven process. Primary areas of responsibility are outlined below in an effort to efficiently and effectively assign areas of focus for each Transition Mentor. All Transition Mentors help with aspects of the programs and event tasks when the need arises.

Students must apply to work for a **minimum of two programs and a maximum of four programs. For example, one Transition Mentor could work Griffon Orientation, Griffon Edge, and Griffon Showcases. Another Transition Mentor could work Griffon Orientation and Griffon Showcases.**

All Returning Mentors

- Attend 4 weekly Transition Mentor training sessions in Spring 2021
- Participate as a MWSU social media ambassador; sharing content from the Office of Admissions and Missouri Western social media accounts
- Act as a role model, and support the learning of all first-time Transition Mentors

Griffon Edge (60-70 positions available)

- Assist in the implementation of an extended orientation program for incoming students
- Serve as a role model for incoming students and peers
- Facilitate and lead group discussions with new MWSU students
- Assist in the set-up and take down for Griffon Edge events
- Participate in night events during the program as a role model for MWSU
- Communicate with small group from Griffon Edge and aid in their transition during the first six weeks of the fall semester
- Other duties as assigned

Griffon Showcases (15 positions available)

- · Assist in the implementation of Griffon Showcases for new students and their families
- Assist in the set-up and take down for Griffon Showcase events
- Other duties as assigned

Griffon Ambassadors (25 positions available)

- Serve as a role model for potential students
- Guide tours of potential students and parents (two set tour times per week)
- Assist with large-scale campus events, such as Commencement, Griffon Showcases, Convocation, etc.
- Other duties as assigned

Griffon Orientation (25 positions available – hired through Handshake in Spring)

- Assist in the implementation of orientation programs for new students and their families
- Serve as a role model for incoming students and peers, and facilitate and lead group discussions with new students
- Assist in the set-up and take down for Orientation events
- Ability to communicate with small groups from orientation and aid in their transition during the first six weeks of the fall semester
- Other duties as assigned

Transition Mentor Position Information

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BENEFITS (for all Transition Mentor Positions)

Transition Mentors can potentially work for four transition programs/positions (Griffon Orientation – official application process will open in the spring, Griffon Edge, Griffon Showcase, Griffon Ambassador) and receive compensation:

- Griffon Edge: \$300 scholarship
- Griffon Showcase: \$150 scholarship (\$75 per semester)
- Griffon Ambassador: \$600 scholarship (\$300 per semester)
- Griffon Orientation Leader: MWSU Student Assistant I hourly rate (hired in Spring 2021)
- All Returning Transition Mentors: \$40 scholarship as compensation for attending spring training

In addition, Transition Mentors will receive all meals during the Griffon Orientation, Griffon Edge, and Griffon Showcase programs, as well as various t-shirts, polos, bags, and other items. Transition Mentors will also develop leadership, facilitation, communication, and PR skills by assisting new and transfer students, as well as families, in their transition to MWSU.

TERMINATION

A Transition Mentor for the Office of Admissions' role may be terminated if it is determined during staff training or during the academic semester program(s) that he/she is not maintaining ethics befitting a paraprofessional, not performing satisfactorily, not able to work productively with others, or jeopardizing the success of the program. If a Transition Mentor does not perform each of the job duties required, his/her scholarship may be adjusted that semester.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

Griffon Edge Mentors, Griffon Showcase Leaders, and Griffon Orientation Leaders report directly to the Events & New Student Program Coordinator of the Office of Admissions. Griffon Ambassadors report directly to the Associate Director of Admissions.

SELECTION PROCESS - APPLICATION

Transition Mentor applications are due no later than **Sunday**, **November 1st**, **2020**, **at 11:59 p.m.** Links to application information can be found at missouriwestern.edu/fye/become-a-leader. Completed applications should include:

- Online application (includes your resume please update it from previous submission)
- View Returning Transition Mentor Overview video (to replace required attendance at an Informational Session, which is now optional)
- Personal Statement uploaded to Google Drive
- Group interview times scheduled online

SELECTION PROCESS – PERSONAL STATEMENT

All returning Transition Mentors will complete a personal statement to be uploaded to a shared Google Drive. This will replace the individual interview. Instructions for the personal statement can be found on our website. Mentors who wish to apply for a Senior Transition Mentor role should refer to the application process found in the Senior Transition Mentor application.

Applicants will sign up for a group interview at the time of their application submission.
