New Honors Program and Requirements

As of this fall, the Honors Department has implemented a new program for both General Studies Honor's completion as well as Majors Honors completion. The biggest change in these two programs are the required credits of UNV 201 through the Honors Department's collaboration with the Center for Service. All incoming freshman honors students are directly accepted into this new General Studies Honors program when they enter Missouri Western and returning honors students now have the choice to switch to this new program or to continue with the old program. Overall, the new program has switched from a previous 24 credits of required Honors coursework to 18 credits.

These 18 credits of required coursework includes 12 hours of honors general studies courses, 4 hours of colloquia, and 2 hours of UNV 201.

In addition to General Studies Honors, Majors Honors has also received a new program. Majors Honors has gone from a previous required 12 credits of honors coursework to 9 credits. These 9 credits include 6 credits of upper-level majors coursework, 2 credits of colloquia, and 1 credit of UNV 201.
