FY 2019 Fiscal Update

- Governor's budget and the Legislature
 - Governor's initial recommendation:
 - Cut of \$2 million (10%).
 - Penalties tied to performance funding.
 - Legislature recommendation:
 - Eliminated appropriation cut
 - Removed performance funding penalties
 - University agrees to charge only a 1% increase in tuition rate



In State Undergraduate Tuition Rate FY 2019

- Background
 - Higher Education Student Funding Act (HESFA) SB 389
 - 2017 change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) 2.1%
- Western's Calculation
 - Average Tuition \$7,006.71
 - $$7,006.71 \times 2.1\% = 147.14
 - \$147.14 divided by 30 credit hours = \$4.90 per hour
- SB 389 Allowed Increase
 - Current FY 2018 SB 389 approved tuition rate \$204.14
 - \$204.14 + \$4.90 = \$209.04
 - Overall increase of 2.4%

- SB 389 Rate Presented for Approval:
 - \$209.04 per hour

In State Undergraduate Tuition Rate Charged FY 2019

- Western's 1% Calculation
 - Western's Average Tuition \$6,692.60
 - $6,692.60 \times 1\% = 66.92$
 - \$66.92 divided by 30 credit hours = \$2.23 per hour
- University agreed 1% increase
 - Current FY 2018 tuition rate \$204.14
 - \$204.14 + \$2.23 = \$206.37
- Rate to be charged: \$206.37 per hour
- Reduced rate is subject to level State Appropriation funding

Reasoning – Room Rate Increase:

- Operation and maintenance costs continue to increase
- Focusing on maintaining a low cost housing option
