# Important Information – Missouri State Law

Missouri State Law 754 section 174.335 require all students who reside in on-campus housing at a public institution of higher education to have received the meningococcal vaccine unless a signed statement of medical or religious exemption is on file with the institution's administration. A medical exemption requires a signed certification by a physician licensed to practice in Missouri indicating that the immunization would seriously endanger the student's health or life or the student has documentation of the disease or laboratory evidence of immunity to the disease (see form on reverse). A religious exemption requires a statement in writing to the institution's administration that the immunization violates his/her religious beliefs (see form on reverse).

# Important Information – Facts about Meningococcal Disease

#### What Is Meningococcal Disease?

Meningococcal disease refers to any illness that is caused by *Neisseria meningitidis*, also known as meningococcus bacteria. The two most severe and common illnesses caused by meningococcus bacteria include meningitis (an infection of the fluid and lining around the brain and spinal cord) and septicemia (a bloodstream infection). **Bacterial meningitis** is very serious and can be deadly. Death can occur in as little as a few hours. While most people with meningitis recover, permanent disabilities such as brain damage, hearing loss, and learning disabilities can result from the infection.

#### **How Is Meningococcal Disease Spread?**

The bacteria that cause meningococcal disease are spread from person to person by sharing respiratory secretions (such as saliva, by kissing or coughing) during close or lengthy contact, especially among people who share a room or live in the same household. Although anyone can get meningococcal disease, teens and college students living in residence halls, are at an increased risk for meningococcal disease compared with other persons of the same age. www.cdc.gov
